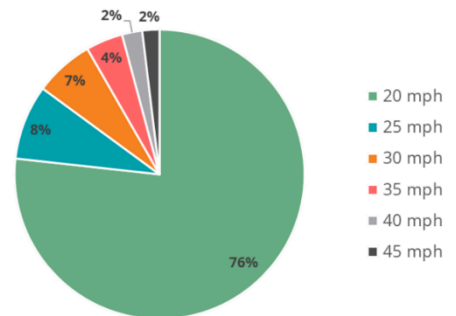

## Community Updates

### Drive at or below 20 mph on residential streets because it's the law and it saves lives

A pie chart representing approximately 2,100 miles of Portland's streets by speed limit as percentages where most (76%) have a 20-mph speed limit.



Did you know the residential speed limit in Portland is 20 mph? It's extra important that people drive slowly on residential streets as they are typically narrow and have few extra protections for people walking, biking, and rolling, e.g., marked crosswalks and bike lanes.

The majority of Portland streets have a 20-mph speed limit  
In 2018, Portland Bureau of Transportation reduced speed limits on most residential streets to 20 mph as part of our Vision Zero goal to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries on our streets. Today, the majority (76%) of Portland's approximately 2,100 miles of streets have a 20-mph speed limit.

We're reducing speed limits to save lives

Why are we so concerned about reducing speed limits? Simply put, it saves lives.

As people travel faster, the risk of death or serious injury rises dramatically. Speed was reported to play a role in at least 42% of deadly crashes between 2017 and 2021, including either driving over the speed limit or driving too fast for road conditions.

## Remember to Water Young Trees

We are moving into longer, warmer, drier days in Portland. That may mean more fun for many of us, but we need to remember our new and recently planted trees, too!

Until the rains return in the fall, trees that have been in the ground for three years or less will need at least 15 - 20 gallons of water each week.

Use a 5-gallon bucket with small holes drilled in the side as shown in the photo. This method provides a handy way to measure how much water you apply. It also ensures a slow flow of water into the soil.

## Typical violations and cost

Per city code, all vehicles in the right-of-way should be registered or have a valid temporary registration placard displayed properly. Vehicles should display both front and rear plates, face the correct direction on the street, and be parked no further than one foot from the curb in a legal parking spot. PBOT's Parking Enforcement team routinely issues citations to comply with these and other state and city laws. In May, officers cited 2,400 vehicles for expired vehicle registration and 670 vehicles for missing license plates.

## Learn About your Right to Vote!

**Who Can Vote Today?** As a result of many battles, laws and amendments, modern day voting is a much simpler matter. To vote in a presidential election today, you must be 18 years old, a

United States citizen and not a convicted felon. Each state has its own requirements, but the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 makes registering simple.

Without regard to political persuasion, religion, race, gender, sexual orientation, education, social standing, or economic condition, you have a responsibility—the responsibility to become informed on the candidates, measures, and issues for each election, then choose wisely. Your vote helps decide who is elected and will lead the community, what is taxed and how taxes are collected, how tax monies are allocated, and what new laws are or are not enacted.
