





Community Updates

Construction continues at six locations, with signal poles and median islands coming this summer to improve safety

Work is underway to construct new pedestrian crossings on 82nd Avenue, at the intersections of 82nd Avenue at **NE Beech**, **Klickitat**, and **Schuyler** streets; and **SE**



<u>Clinton</u>, <u>Ash</u>, and <u>Schiller</u> streets. In the coming weeks, contractors with PBOT are continuing curb ramp construction and excavation for electrical conduit and signal foundations. As soon as July, contractors will begin installing signal poles and constructing median islands. Later this fall after temperatures drop, trees will be planted in these median islands. We anticipate construction will be complete in spring 2025.

In a 10-year period (2012-2021), more than 90% of traffic deaths on 82nd Avenue were people walking or biking, or people in cars turning left at locations without signals. Safe crossings and median islands are two of the most effective measures to reduce or eliminate those types of crashes.

If you are not familiar, RBJ is a creative, placemaking event, which includes activities, entertainment, and opportunities for community engagement. Place + Memory, works on paper by Nancy Larson

Spur Gallery is pleased to announce the opening of *Place + Memory*, a collection of works on paper by Nancy Larson. Larson is a Cully neighborhood painter whose work primarily focuses on the abstracted landscape. She explores the connection between place and memory and where these two intersect: where the tangible and intangible meet and where what and how we remember informs how the world looks to us. This group of small watercolor and gouache paintings are explorations into this hazy middle land, inviting the viewer into a place that feels unfamiliar yet oddly like home.

Spur is a no-profit gallery dedicated to art and equity. 80% of all sales goes directly to the artist while the entirety of the remaining 20% is donated to organizations working for social justice. For this show, Spur Gallery and Nancy Larson are proud to support Street Books (**streetbooks.org**), a bicycle-powered mobile library for people living outside and at the margins in Portland. Since 2011, Street Books has empowered people on the streets through access to literature, and created a community of support through a shared love of books.
